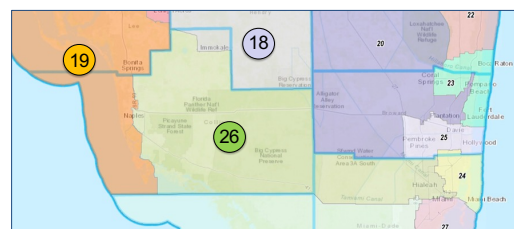

Florida now has 28 seats in the U.S. House, gaining one seat in redistricting



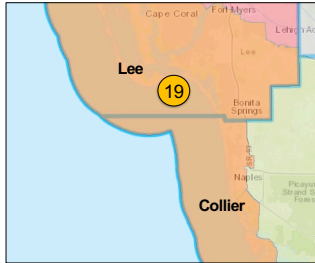

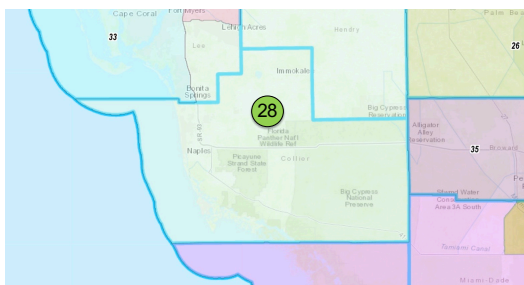

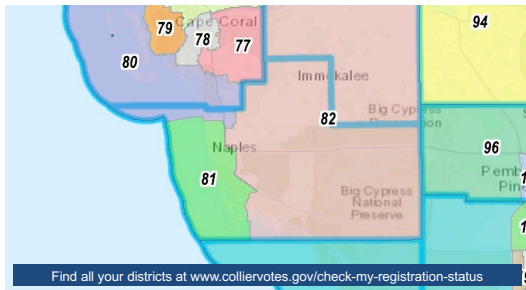
